

**VIII COMMONWEALTH SHOOTING FEDERATION CHAMPIONSHIPS 2010
NEW DELHI, INDIA (17th to 28th FEBRUARY 2010)**

TECHNICAL REGULATIONS

- 1) **ARRIVAL OF DELEGATES** 17th February 2010

- 2) **DATES**
 - a) **Training**

PET will be provided on the day before the Pairs event. The Pairs / Badge event will count as PET for the Individual event, except 3 x 20 who due to programming will have 2 x PET.
Other practice will be subject to range availability and at the discretion of the CRO for that range. A charge may be made for other practice.
 - b) **Competition** 19th to 27th February 2010
 - c) **Departure** 28th February 2010

- 3) **VENUE**

Dr. Karni Singh Shooting Ranges, Tughlakabad, New Delhi (Rifle/Pistol & Shotgun)
Kadarpur Range – CRPF Campus, Gurgaon (Full Bore events)

- 4) **RANGE EQUIPMENT**
 - a) **Trap, Double Trap & Skeet** 6 combined ranges equipped with Laporte machines
 - b) **50m Range** 80 Points – Sius Ascor
 - c) **25m Range** 12 Groups of 5 targets each – Sius Ascor
 - d) **Air Range** 80 Points – Sius Ascor
 - e) **Finals Hall** Sius Ascor Targets
 - f) **300M/Full Bore Range** 20 Points – shot on ICFRA targets

- 5) **RULES**
 - a) The ISSF competitions will be conducted according to the current Rules and Regulations of the International Shooting Sport Federation (ISSF) together with any CSF variations.
 - b) Technical problems if any shall be resolved in accordance with the Rules of the ISSF.
 - c) In case of disagreement in the interpretation of the technical rules, the English text of the ISSF shall prevail.
 - d) Fullbore Queens Prize will be conducted in accordance with CSF Rules and Regulations

6) EVENTS

The championship shall comprise of the following ISSF events:-

a) Trap, Skeet & Double Trap

g) Finals will be conducted in all Olympic events and may be conducted in non Olympic events, subject to agreement at the Technical meetings.

h) Please be advised that if less than six countries are entered in an individual event by the return date of the Preliminary entry form, that event (together with the equivalent Pairs event) will be deleted from the official program and the countries that have entered for that event will be immediately advised by email / fax.

Preliminary entry fees received for cancelled events will be refunded.

7) PARTICIPATION

- a) **Eligibility:** - Only currently affiliated CSF Member Associations are eligible to participate.
- b) **Individual:** - Each country may enter a maximum of 3 shooters per event.
- c) **Pairs:** - The Pairs events will be conducted separately. The participating countries will nominate two out of the three shooters entered for the Individual events for the pair in the same event.
- d) **Badge:** - All three shooters entered for the Individual event are eligible for the Badge event which will be shot in conjunction with the Pairs event.

8) MQS

There will be no ISSF MQS status for this championship.

9) ANTI DOPING CONTROL

Anti Doping Tests will be carried out in all events. Urine samples will be collected by medical staff and these will be sent to one of the IOC approved Testing Laboratory.

10) COMPETITION PROGRAMME

Final programme is attached but subject to change in accordance with clause 6 (h) and change in event / Finals / Award Ceremony timings once preliminary and final entries are received.

Adjusted events will remain on the same day.

11) ENTRY FEES

- a) Euro 150 per shooter for Individual events
- b) Euro 100 per shooter for combined Pairs and Badge event
- c) Euro 50 per team official

12) COMPETITION JURIES

13) PROTESTS

Protests must be accompanied by protest fee as prescribed in ISSF Rules. This fee will be refunded if the protest is upheld. Protest against any decision of the Jury must be submitted in writing to the Jury of Appeal not later than one hour after the Jury decision has been announced. The decision of the Jury of Appeal is final and cannot be protested.

14) MEDAL CEREMONY

Gold, Silver and Bronze medals will be awarded for the Individual and Pair events. Diplomas will be issued to the top 8 in each individual and pair event. However participate certificate will be issued to all participates.

All participants including officials will receive the Commemorative medals.

The medal ceremony for ISSF Rifle and Pistol will be held as per the attached schedule in the Final Hall. Shotgun award ceremonies will be held at the shotgun range. 300m and Queens Prize award ceremonies will be held at the Kardarpur range.

15) CLAY TARGETS

Orange colour targets will be used during practice, Pairs events and Individual Qualification competitions. Flash Targets will be used for Finals.

Euro 7.00 will be charged for each round of 25 targets of Trap and Skeet practice and Pre Event training.

Euro 14.00 will be charged for each round of Double Trap practice and Pre Event training.

16) TRANSPORT

Transport will be arranged from Indira Gandhi International Airport to official accommodation and back.

Shuttle Bus service will be provided between Official accommodations to Range every day as per the transport schedule which will be notified on arrival. There will be no extra cost for the transport for participants who are resident at the official accommodation and have booked via NRAI.

Karni Singh participants who book direct with any of the official accommodation venues will be required to pay a E100 transport fee to cover pick up from the airport and return together with accommodation to range and return transport.

No transport will be provided from non official accommodation.

17) FIREARMS AND AMMUNITION

In order to maintain the smooth handling of fire arms, ammunition and ensure their security, please follow the following instructions which are essential for the customs clearance at the Port of entry and departure.

- a) On arrival at the Indira Gandhi International Airport New Delhi, the fire arms and ammunition will be transported directly to the armoury located at the Dr. Karni Singh Shooting ranges. In case of Full Bore shooters, the weapons will be transported to Kadarpur Shooting Ranges from Indira Gandhi International Airport.
- b) During competitions, these are to be kept on the Ranges and will not be allowed to be taken to the Hotel.
- c) At the time of departure, the same procedure will be followed for conveying of weapons and ammunition from the Range to the Indira Gandhi International Airport. The Team Managers of each country will be required to take over the fire arms and ammunition from the armoury located at the Shooting Ranges. All the teams are required to obtain DGCA permit to take out their weapons and unused ammunition at the Delhi Airport. All the participating countries are required to send us the attached form duly filled to obtain DGCA permit by us on their behalf.

- d) Team Managers are requested to send full details of weapons i.e. number, type, make and ammunition of the team members. The Gun permit fee is Euro 20 per shooter.

19) REGISTRATION (Drawing for Lots)

The drawing for shooting stations and firing points will be carried out in the presence of the Technical Delegate and Jury before commencement of the competition.

20) FIRE ARMS AND EQUIPMENT

All firearms and equipment will be inspected before the competition by the authorised Jury and Equipment Control Officers. The inspection seals placed on the firearms and equipment should not be removed from them without permission.

21) ISSF IDENTIFICATION (ID) NO.

All those shooters participating in this championship who possess an ISSF ID No. must enter this ID number on the relevant entry forms.

22) SHOOTER DECLARATION

Shooters participating in this championship must sign the “Shooter Declaration” Form which will be issued to team leaders on arrival and must be submitted to the Competition Office before the start of the competition.

23) NATIONAL FLAG & ANTHEM

All member federations are requested to bring two National Flags (1m x 1.5m) and 1 recorded cassette tape of their NATIONAL ANTHEM for the victory ceremony.

24) ACCOMMODATION

All Karni Singh shooters and team officials will be accommodated in Hotels near the range. The Full Bore shooters and officials would be accommodated at Kardarpur Range. The lodging charges are as under:

- a. Karni Singh – 5 star – Share twin rooms – E 100 Per person bed and breakfast
- b. Karni Singh - 3 star - Share twin rooms - E 75 Per person bed and breakfast
- c. Karni Singh – Motel –Share Twin rooms - E 35 Per person bed and breakfast
- d. Kardarpur Range – Single rooms E 70 per person per day – including breakfast, lunch and dinner.

Single rooms at Karni Singh accommodation may be available on request at appropriate rates.

25) WEATHER CONDITIONS DURING FEBRUARY 2010

Maximum temperature is 25°C and minimum temperature 11°C. Generally clear skies with comfortable temperature.

Technical meeting for all events held at Karni Singh Range will be held at 1300 hours in the 10m range on Thursday 18th February.

Technical Meeting for fullbore shooting will be held in the lounge of the Kardarpur accommodation block at 1800 hours on Thursday 18th February followed by dinner and the fullbore shooters forum. CSF Executive and General meeting dates, times and venues will be advised later.

Official bulletins and announcements including firing commands at the Shooting Ranges will be in English only in accordance with the ISSF Rules.
